MATT BORDERS

Mr. Borders is a National Park Service Ranger at Monocacy National Battlefield. He previously worked in a similar role at Antietam National Battlefield and with the American Battlefield Protection Program. He is a Certified Antietam Battlefield Guide and the co-author of the forthcoming book, *Faces of Union Soldiers at Antietam*.

MARC LEEPSON

Mr. Leepson is the author of nine books, including *Desperate Engagement: How a Little-Known Civil War Battle Saved Washington, D.C., and Changed American History*. He has appeared on multiple radio and television shows, including CBS This Morning, the History Channel, and Book TV. He holds both Bachelor's and Master's degrees in history from George Washington University.

SCOTT PATCHAN

Mr. Patchan is a leading scholar and battlefield guide on the Shenandoah Valley during the Civil War. He has written four books on the region and and dozens of articles in publications such as *Blue and Gray*, *North and South*, and *Civil War Times*. He also serves as a member of the Kernstown Battlefield Board of Directions. He is the author of *Shenandoah Summer: The 1864 Valley Campaign*. Mr. Patchan will be one of our tour guides on Sunday.

KEVIN PAWLAK

Mr. Pawlak is a Historic Site Manager for Prince William Historic Preservation and a Certified Antietam Battlefield Guide. He is on the Board of Directors of the Save Historic Antietam Foundation and the Friends of Ball's Bluff. He is the author or co-author of two books, including *To Hazard All: A Guide to the Maryland Campaign, 1862*.

STEVE PHAN

Mr. Phan is a National Park Service Ranger at the Civil War Defenses of Washington. Previously, he worked at Richmond National Battlefield, Hopewell Culture National Historical Park, and Rock Creek Park. A military history scholar of the Civil War era, he is the author of articles about Asians and Pacific Islanders in the Civil War and the Defenses of Washington.

RYAN QUINT

Mr. Quint graduated from the University of Mary Washington and works as an interpreter at Colonial Williamsburg. He previously served as a park historian at Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park. He is the author of *Determined to Stand and Fight: The Battle of Monocacy, July 9, 1864*.

KEVEN WALKER

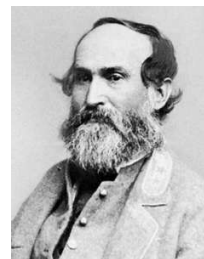
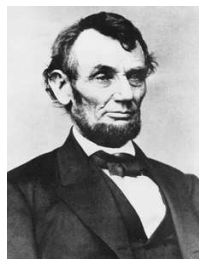
